Our **Community Employment Partnership Program** provides job readiness training and supportive services to our formerly homeless residents, some of whom are military veterans. Through our Supportive Employment Model, we help our Project H.O.M.E. community members in their transition to employment and stability.

Steady employment and a career track is essential to the transition from homelessness to permanent independence. Being self-sufficient, contributing members of the community means greater self-worth and a much brighter future for our community members.

By the time they're ready for hire, many of our community members have undergone supervised paid internships within Project H.O.M.E. We offer our residents various full-time and part-time internal employment opportunities in residential support staff positions and through one of our two social business enterprises: our H.O.M.E Page Café (located inside of the main branch of the Free Library of Philadelphia) and the Our Daily Threads shop (located at 1515 Fairmount Avenue).

During employment outside of Project H.O.M.E., we support our community members with comprehensive job coaching through a well-coordinated team effort involving our Employment Services team, our Adult Learning educators and our workforce development specialists.

We maintain continued support and strong productive relationships with our clients and their employers to promote success in the workplace.
