What: Homeless Memorial Day Philadelphia, an annual event commemorated in over 150

localities across the United States on or near the first day of winter, recognizes those who have lost their lives while homeless or experienced homelessness. This year's memorial will

- Music by Magic Music Group and Circle of Hope

(Rain location: Arch Street United Methodist Church, 55 North Broad Street, Philadelphia)

Why: Last year in Philadelphia, homeless outreach organizations engage more than 6,500

individuals living on the street or in cars, abandoned buildings, transit stations, and other places not meant for human habitation. At least 15,000 people, including families, accessed

shelter last year.

An important step in addressing homelessness is to assert the fundamental dignity of all persons who are in situations of homelessness and poverty, and to work tirelessly to protect their basic human and civil rights. A proper memorial truly nurtures a spirit of community and

compassion for all individuals.
