

# VOTE TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8

Polls are open from 7am-8pm & Mail-in Ballots are due by 8pm

## WHERE DO I VOTE?

*Confirm Polling Site Before You Vote*

*You can also call this number if you have any problems voting.*
- **ONLINE:** [vote.pa.gov/status](https://vote.pa.gov/status) to find out where you are registered.

## MAIL-IN BALLOT INFORMATION

- **Mail Option:** Applications for mail-in ballots must be received by the county election office by 5pm on November 1. Mail-in ballots must be **received** by 8pm on November 8.
- **Deliver by 8pm on Election Day:** In Philadelphia, you can bring your mail-in ballot to City Hall or 520 N. Columbus Blvd.
- **Check ballot status:** [vote.pa.gov/MailBallotStatus](https://vote.pa.gov/MailBallotStatus)
- **If you cannot hand deliver your ballot to the Board of Elections or another location:** You can still go to your polling location. Bring your ballot and voter declaration envelope to your polling location, sign that you have not already voted, and vote in person.
- **What if your mail-in ballot did not come in time?** Anyone who requested a mail-in ballot can vote in person on a provisional (paper) ballot. You won't be allowed to vote on the city's voting machines, but you can vote by paper ballot and it will be counted later.

## NEED VOTER ID?

Voters only need ID if it is their first time voting at a new polling site.

## WHO IS ON THE BALLOT?

You'll be deciding on candidates running for the U.S. Senate and House, governor, lieutenant governor, and state Senate and House.

## WHO CAN VOTE?

- All Pennsylvanians who are registered by Monday October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022
- Persons with felony convictions ARE allowed to vote after their release. (This includes those on probation, parole, and house arrest.)
